First-semester Swedish Elementary Swedish I

Cultural topics include: Nature conservation and environmental protection (Allemansrätten), Greta Thunberg, social etiquettes, fika and lördagsgodis, letters å, ä, ö, and dialects.

Second-Semester Swedish Elementary Swedish II

Cultural topics include: The Nobel Prize, Sweden Day, snus (Google it!), Påskkärringar and witches, and how fun the names of your relatives are in Swedish: mormor, morfar, farmor, farfar.
